Services are geared towards moving homeless men toward independent living on a permanent basis. Services include lodging, three meals, daily shower and laundry, personal hygiene items, health evaluation, prescriptions, clothing, transportation, and counseling and dental services. Required counseling is structured to help the homeless find employment, improve their education, and receive substance abuse treatment from an outside source, along with their many other needs. All services offered by the shelter program are free of charge to those served.
